- Have you ever said or done something that disgusted someone? What happened?
- Have you ever said or done something that ostracized you from your friends or family? Would anyone like to tell us about it?
- Why do you think it was it such a big deal that Jesus ate with Zacchaeus?
- Did you identify more with Zacchaeus or with the crowd in this story? Why?
- This week, how do you think God might be calling you to make this story personal?
