- Like the woman in this story, have you ever done something sinful that would bring you shame it if were made public? Why do you think we sin, despite the risks?
- Did you identify more with the woman or with the crowd in this story? Why?
- Let's make a plan for how we can respond next time we're tempted to condemn someone for their sin. How can we learn to respond with grace instead of judgment?
- This week, how do you think God might be calling you to make this story personal?
