## THE BIBLE

Genesis - Exodus; Isaiah 53; Romans 8:31-40

- Have you ever had to wait for something you really wanted? What was it and how long did you have to wait?
- We heard a lot of stories from the Old Testament this month. Which of those stories or people surprised you the most, and why?
- What questions do you still have about the people or stories we've talked about?
- What does God's plan (from Genesis to Jesus) tell us about what God is like?
- Read Romans 8:31-40. What words or phrases do you most connect with? How has your understanding of this passage deepened in the last few weeks?
- How do we know that God is "for" us?
- What are some reasons it could be difficult for someone to believe God is for them?
- What are some ways we can help others see that God is for them?
- What are some needs in our neighborhoods that Jesus would have met?
- What can our group do together to show others that we are for them?

Spend time as a group talking about how you can do something to love, serve, and be "for" others together. Put a plan in place to do something for others together.
